Yardage & Cutting- Cont

Cream/Multi Pansy Abundance 1-5/8 yds
Stripe (2566-99)
Cut (4) VERTICAL 6-1/2" wide stripes,
centering Pansies

Backing 3-3/8 yds

Large Square Ruler - at least 11" square
Binding Miter Tool


Construction:

This project uses precise 1/4" seams. To test your seam allowance, accurately cut (2) 1-1/2" x 3" rectangles. Stitch them together along the 3" length. Measure across the unit. It should be exactly 2-1/2" wide. If not, adjust your seam and repeat.

1. Thinking about the direction of the stems, sew three of the 11" squares of 4 Pansy Blocks in a row with 2" x 11" Purple Dotted Damask between the blocks and at both ends. Press toward the Purple. It will be 38" long, raw edge to raw edge.



2. Attach a 2" x 38" Purple Dotted Damask above and below the Step 1 unit. Press toward the Purple.



Yardage & Cutting:

Number in parenthesis is the quantity to cut

Cream/Multi Pansy Abundance 1 yd
Diamond Patch (2565-99)
Fussy Cut (5) 11" squares, each centering
4 Pansy Blocks

Purple Dotted Damask (2569-66) 3/8 yd
Cut (6) 2" strips into:
(2) 2" x 38"
(2) 2" x 14"
(8) 2" x 11"

Cream Petite Pansy (2568-07) 5/8 yd
Cut (1) 19" strip into:
(1) 19" square
(2) 10-1/2" squares

Black Dotted Damask (2569-12) 3/4 yd
Cut (6) 2-1/2" strips for Binding
Cut (4) 2" strips for Inner Border


3. Again, thinking about the direction of the stems, stitch a 2" x 11" Purple Dotted Damask to both sides of the remaining two 11" squares of 4 Pansy blocks.




4. Add a 2" x 14" Purple Dotted Damask to the appropriate top or bottom edge of the Step 3 units.




5. Cut the 19" square of Cream Petite Pansy in fourths, like an 'X'.




6. Sew the Step 5 Triangles to both sides of the Step 4 units.




7. Attach the Step 6 units above and below the Step 2 unit, lining up the Purple. Press.



8. Cut the 10-1/2" squares of Cream Petite Pansy diagonally in half.



9. Stitch a Step 8 Triangle to each of the 4 ends. Trim so the sides are straight. There should be at least 1/4" beyond the Purple corners.




10. Measure the height of the quilt through the middle and cut (2) Inner Border strips that length. Sew them to two opposite sides. Measure the width, including these two borders, through the middles. Cut and attach the top and bottom Inner Borders. Press.



11. Attach the Pansy Abundance Stripe borders. Begin and end at the 1/4" seam allowance at each corner, and leave a 7" miter 'tail' extending.

12. Place a corner to miter on your ironing board, with the border that is lying horizontal extending to the right, and the one that is vertical on top of it and extending up. Fold the top extending border diagonally under and position so it is exactly on top of the one extending to the right. Once you are satisfied that the miter is correct, smash it with the iron.



13. Use a pin or two to hold the mitered corner in place. From the underside, stitch in the pressed crease. Check to see that it's correct and if it is, trim the excess from the seam to 1/4". Press these seams open. Repeat Steps 12-13 for each of the corners to be mitered.



14. Layer your quilt and prepare to quilt your masterpiece. We suggest outlining the Pansies in the blocks and in the Border, add a simple floral to the remainder.

15. Bind with the 2-1/2 strips specified, following the instructions with the Binding Miter Tool. There is also a video demo of this terrific tool at [YouTube.com](https://www.youtube.com)
